  - CDBG grant for the construction of the well (\$600,000) It appears that it will be approved. We just have to wait for an executed contract, which could take a couple of months.
  - Still awaiting results of Resilience Grant applications (for Hampton Villas Drainage Project).
  - CQR Census dispute is still ongoing. We had much back and forth with them initially, however, it now seems to be resolved. Waiting on their response.
  - Ms. Hildreth was contacted by SRWMD regarding some potential funding for AMI meters. We wouldn't have to go through a full application process, just submit through the portal. She has contacted Columbia County and Lake Butler for information on their AMI meters. She has reached out to the meter company for cost information to submit a budget to the SRWMD (as well as a narrative).

- Cox Broadband representatives met with Ms. Hildreth to discuss their infrastructure grant application to bring broadband to the Hampton area. She provided a letter of support on behalf of the city.
- Community Resource Hubs are still developing, the first pilot will be in Starke. Hampton Elementary is out as a potential location as it has been leased.
- LIHWAP (Low Income Household Water Assistance Program) is finally ready to move forward with Suwanee River Community Council.

B. Water Looping Bid Results/Contractor Selection

Ms. Hildreth presented the bid results as well as the recommendations by the engineer and Bernard Carter. U. S. Water Services Corp. was the second lowest bidder but based on their work on Phase 1, knowledge of our water system and an unfavorable review by a reference, it was recommended we accept their bid proposal.

# Motion made to award the contract to U.S. Water Services Corp. Was mad by Councilwoman Shealey, seconded by Vice Chair Williamson. Passed 4 - 0

# C. Fire Department Building

City Clerk/Admin

Ms. Hildreth advised that Chief Carter, from the Bradford County Fire Department, had advised her that they will no longer need to lease the fire department building from the city. They had just been using it for storage. A termination letter needs to be submitted to the city, then look into transferring the electric and the liability insurance to the city. Discussion of potential uses, including a community center – however, that would entail major renovations.

# 9. Council general announcements/discussions

Chair Goodge acknowledged Ms. Elaine Nield, who stated no parking signs were put on both sides of Plum Street (in front of her house and at City Park). She understands her tenant had parked partially in the street blocking ingress and egress and that it should not have happened. The signs on her side have since been removed. She also said one of her tenants had received a warning from a Sheriff's deputy about living in an RV, however many people in the city and Bradford County are living in RVs, so she feels if it's going to be an issue it should be enforced on everybody. Mr. Sexton advised this is a statewide issue that you can't have a non-permanent dwelling for extended periods of time (no more than 180 days). Council consensus was not to pursue enforcement at this time.
